



### ST XAVIER'S



St. XAVIER'S COLLEGE was founded in 1869 by the Society of Jesus, a Christian Religious Organization started by St. Ignatius of Loyola. Since its very inception, the Society has significantly contributed to the field of education throughout the world, inspired by a vision of the human, drawn from the life, teachings and personality of Jesus Christ. In India, it was St. Francis Xavier, after whom the College is named, who began the educational work of the Society of Jesus. St. Xavier's College is a Christian institution, started with the purpose of educating the Christian community in India.

It extends its services to members of other communities as an effort at building a truly inter-religious and inter-cultural human community in the country. On January 30, 1869, it was affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It became a Constituent College of the University, as a result of the Mumbai University Act 1953. It is entrusted by the University with the task of preparing students for degrees in Arts, Science, Commerce, Mass Media, Management Studies and Information Technology.

### **DG RUPAREL**





Founder: The college was established by the Modern Education Society, Pune, a trust founded in 1932. Named After: Damodar G. Ruparel, a philanthropist and industrialist who made significant contributions to education.

Ruparel boasts one of the greenery-rich campuses among Mumbai colleges. Its well-divided buildings, multiple study and leisure zones, and a dedicated sports and cultural infrastructure offer a holistic student environment. Some older structures are currently under renovation, but overall the campus remains functional and vibrant

### **SOMAIYA**





K.J. Somaiya College in Vidyavihar was the first institution built in the now 60-acre Somaiya campus. Designed by architect Atul Shah of Access Architects, its foundation stone was laid by then Chief Minister Yashwantrao Chavan. The college follows a modernist institutional style, with a modular RCC structure using materials like brick, steel, and glass. Spanning 7,000 square meters, the G+3 building hosts 8 to 20 rooms per floor and is divided into three sections for different colleges. Set beside MG Road and surrounded by residential areas, the campus includes gathering spaces like gardens, a canteen, and a pavilion—making it a vibrant educational hub within Mumbai's urban fabric.


### **MITHIBAI**



**MITHIBAI COLLEGE** was established in 1961. Before that there was an ashram by the name of MATUSHRI MITHIBAI BALASHRAM which was owned by the popular Kapoor family of Bollywood. They later Sold off the plot of land and the money that was gained from the sale was donated to SVKM.

Mithibai College, located on VM Road in Vile Parle (W), is a nine-storey structure that has evolved from an earlier two-floor building. Facing a busy street with shops at the front and a sewage line at the back, the college has four entrances and a large double-height entrance lobby. Classrooms, admission offices, and science labs are arranged along central corridors, with labs placed at the rear (south) for easy access to plumbing and ventilation. The building, made of reinforced concrete, features vertical planning, Kota stone flooring, and an upgraded 2007 façade with aluminum panels and glass to reduce heat.


#### **SOMAIYA**



Area of site:11,900m.sq






We analyzed how the plot area associates with the form of a institution therefore its functionality, makes it a different type. Also, every institution has a different type of neighborhood.




#### **MITHIBAI**




### **MASS AND VOID**

Balanced layout of built spaces (mass) and open areas (void). Includes courtyards, green spaces, and buildings. it transforms from open to semi –open space like corridor.


#### **SOMAIYA**

In Mithibai there is outer layer of open space then then transforms to closed space more than that its public verses private space






Circulation in space is the way body moves within the space and navigate itself and circulate. There is movement of body through the long corridors, open spaces canteen.



#### **MITHIBAI**


Mithibai has two main axis to move through along which the college is divided also there is symmetry if it cut through its central axis.

















### **CONCLUSION**
